Re: SB 91 – Testimony in Support w/Adoption of the Dash 1 Amendment

Chair Lively, Vice-Chairs Gamba and Levy, and members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association and the EMS and Fire Chapter of SDAO, we are testifying in support of SB 91 with adoption of the Dash-1 amendment. As fire service leaders, we appreciate efforts to make our profession safer and reduce the risks of occupational disease for our firefighters.

This bill would make Oregon the 16th state to prohibit the use of Aqueous Film-Forming Foam (AFFF) in fire suppression. Under the bill, fire departments and districts will be required to phase out AFFF use by July 2026. Fortunately, a PFAS-free foam alternative, known as P3, is already being utilized at Oregon's largest airport, PDX, as well as other airports across the state. Recognizing the health and environmental importance of this transition, Oregon became the first state in the nation to eliminate AFFF from its major airport firefighting foam inventory for use in petroleum-based aircraft fire incidents.

This bill takes the necessary and responsible steps to remove AFFF from the broader Oregon fire service in a phased and manageable manner. Additionally, the Oregon fire service remains committed to working in consultation with the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to ensure the proper disposal and safe removal of any remaining AFFF from fire stations.

Thank you for your commitment to the well-being of Oregon's fire service professionals.
