My name is Mica Contreras, and I am the Executive Director of the Linn Benton Lincoln Health Alliance. In our community, this issue is not abstract; it is something we feel and face every single day. Language barriers in the licensing process have been brought to our coalition time and time again by community members who are eager to fully participate in Oregon's economy and civic life but are blocked by tests that are simply not accessible in their language.

That's why I'm urging your support for HB 2990. This bill takes a thoughtful, practical approach to fixing preventable language barriers. It requires ODOT to improve the accessibility of the Class C written test through accurate translation, clarity in wording, and attention to dialects. It also ensures transparency and accountability by requiring a progress report to the legislature by fall of 2026.

This matters across the region we represent and the entire state. Whether in a rural community where public transit is nearly nonexistent or in a city where navigating daily life depends on a car, the ability to get a license changes everything. It opens doors to jobs, independence, and dignity. HB 2990 is about fairness, opportunity, and public safety, strengthening Oregon's social and economic fabric.

Thank you for your leadership and service to our state. I respectfully urge your support for HB 2990.
