Dear Joint Committee on Transportation,

I live about a block from a grade school in southeast Portland, and every morning around 8 AM my neighborhood is filled with children on their way to school--on bicycles, on foot, in their parents' cars, and in school buses. It does my heart good to see them, but I know that if they are to have any hope of growing up into a world that is not disrupted more than it already is by climate change, then we, their elders, must end our burning of fossil fuels immediately--not at some ill-defined future time. Each of us must do all we can to assure their future, which is why I recently replaced my gas furnace with an electric heat pump and installed solar panels on my roof. You can help as well by approving HB 2945 to move from gasoline- and diesel-powered buses to electric school buses. We should have done this years ago. The technology is now available, and the need is urgent. This bill incentivizes replacing carbon-dioxide-producing vehicles with electric-powered ones. It's a small but immediate step in the right direction, which is why I support it. It will benefit all of us, but especially those children who have not created this mess, but who will bear the consequences. Please adopt HB 2945.
