In 2014 I served on the 'Task Force on Pollinator Health' HB 4139. The Oregon Bee Atlas came about due to HB-4139. One of the important goals that HB-4139 addressed was how to protect and enhance the pollinators Oregon has. A critical component is we did not know how many plants are pollinated or by whom. This would be addressed by the OregonFlora and the Oregon Bee Atlas.
