Whether I am teaching a team member the difference between a willow or alder species onsite, identifying offsite habitat zones for seed collection, using the Flora of Oregon books to key plants or discern important species from one another, or using OregonFlora's online tools to identify an invasive species onsite, I am constantly reminded through my livelihood just how crucial this resource is.

As someone who participates in native plant conservation work, I appreciate having access to comprehensive and readily accessible data that is curated by taxonomists.
