I'm reaching out to express my strong support for HB 2979, which would allocate essential funding to Oregon's farmers, ranchers, food hubs, and farmers markets.

Our state's small farms and local food networks are facing growing risks from wildfires and other extreme weather events. HB 2979 addresses these challenges head-on by supporting Food Systems Resilience Programs that strengthen climate resilience, promote conservation, boost rural economies, and support small business development. These efforts do more than just help producers—they build stronger, healthier communities through increased access to local food, expanded nutrition programs, and spaces that bring people together.

This bill received unanimous approval from the House Committee on Agriculture, Land Use, Natural Resources, and Water, backed by more than 200 pieces of testimony—including a letter of support signed by 248 farms, food hubs, farmers markets, and community organizations across the state.
