I want to share one example where funding would make our institution stronger: hiring new faculty. Because Oregon had a low cost of living for a long time, it was easy for us to hire new faculty--often young people, fresh out of grad school. That's changed (especially in the Portland metro) in the last 15 years, as we all know. I have served on countless hiring committees where excellent, passionate experts turn down our job offers--because they can make more doing similar work in Washington or California.
