On behalf of the Oregon Advocacy Commissions and our Joint Subcommittee on Domestic & Sexual Violence Prevention and Statewide Coordination, we stand in strong support of SB 710, which seeks to evaluate and implement domestic and sexual violence education for Oregon’s judiciary. As a Joint Subcommittee dedicated to the advancement of gender equity and justice, we recognize the urgent need for a judiciary that is equipped with the necessary knowledge and training to adjudicate cases involving domestic and sexual violence effectively and fairly.

Survivors of domestic and sexual violence frequently encounter systemic barriers to justice, including a lack of understanding from decision-makers about the complex nature of abuse and trauma.
