I have been a part of helping ODFW plant hatchery fish in the McKenzie for about 6 years now. I have been startled by the difference in quality (that is health) between fish from the Leaburg Hatchery and other locations. Fish from other hatcheries have significantly higher injury and mortality rates. When they are being put into the boat for transportation down the river, there is a significant difference in the water they are carried in, amount of foam and turbidity in the water.

Unless they are from here, they are startled by the clarity and the quality of the water in the McKenzie. We have in are backyard an incredible resource that is accessible and appreciated by people from around the world.
