On behalf of the Oregon Advocacy Commissions and our Joint Subcommittee on Domestic & Sexual Violence Prevention and Statewide Coordination, we write in strong support of HB 2456, legislation that modifies provisions relating to the Sexual Assault Victims' Emergency Medical Response Fund.
