HB 2979 renews the state's investment in <u>community food system resilience</u>:

- \$3.5M for OCFSN's Farmer and Rancher Disaster Resilience Grant Program
- \$2M for OCFSN's Food Hub Climate Resilience & Worker Safety Grant Fund
- \$2.5M for OFMA's Farmers Market Climate Resilience Grant Fund and grants to farmers markets for costs associated with acceptance of SNAP benefits

Eligible Projects Include:

Farmers:

- Irrigation modernization & soil health projects for drought resilience
- Shading & cooling for heat waves
- Wildfire evacuation equipment and planning

Farmers Markets:

- Market cooling interventions (misters/shading) for heat waves
- Heaters for winter markets
- PPE for wildfire smoke protection

Food Hubs:

- Refrigeration equipment to take in more food when markets close
- Worker safety equipment like fatigue mats
- Food safe transportation to pick up and deliver local food

Dear Oregon Lawmakers:

But, when wildfires, storms, or extreme heat disrupt market operations, producers suffer--unable to get their products to market, or worse, when their perishable produce is ruined," explained Anna Curtin, Co-chair of the Oregon Farmers Markets Association.

"This funding represents a collaborative effort to help our state's small and midsize, highly diversified and local market farmers adapt to the ongoing effects of the climate crisis. We are so proud to be a part of this coalition of forward thinking food system advocates, farmers, and policy makers who made this happen. Oregon is so lucky to still have a thriving small scale farming community. Our farmers are on the front lines of climate change and this funding helps those who need it most," said Alice Morrison, Co-Executive Director of Friends of Family Farmers.

Oregon's small farms, farmers' markets, and food hubs strengthen our communities and deserve your continued support in the face of increasing wildfires and extreme weather events.
