Please make large private timber operations pay their fair share for wildfire suppression, recovery and prevention. I have seen my electricity rates increase from Pacific Power due to their negligence of not maintaining their power line easements. We need the wealthy business operators in this state paying for wildfire recovery, just as residents in Oregon are being asked to!

Millions of acres of Oregon's forestland are privately owned by wealthy Wall Street Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs), which allow those forest owners to pay little in corporate income taxes. For too long, Oregonians and small woodland forest owners have been paying a disproportionate share to protect public and private forestland. Reinstating the timber severance tax is a fair solution for all Oregonians.

Oregon is experiencing hotter and drier weather, with wildfires that are more expensive and damaging than ever before. In 2024, wildfire suppression (AKA firefighting) cost taxpayers \$350 million. Private forest owners benefit greatly from public efforts to contain wildfires. Every year, public funds help protect private assets that are worth billions of dollars.

HB 3489-1 asks for large timber companies to pay their fair share for fire prevention and suppression. It does not increase taxes on smaller woodland owners or residents across the state.

Show us the Oregon Legislature will make sure everyone is contributing to wildfire costs, not just residents and the government of Oregon!
