The reason is straightforward: we have exhausted our supply of buildable land. The remaining parcels inside the Urban Growth Boundary are steep, costly, and impractical to develop, which drives up prices and pushes everyday working families out of the market.

HB 3921 provides a practical fix. It does *not* expand the UGB; it simply swaps unusable, hillside acreage inside the boundary for flat, service-ready land just outside. This balanced approach keeps growth contained while opening sites where affordable, workforce housing can actually be built.
