NO on SB 1191 A

It has been suggested that this bill is to cover the Governor and Attorney General in giving sanctuary state advice to protect noncitizens. Maybe they think that state law can trump federal law. It cannot. This is an anti-Tom Homan bill. This is "aiding and abetting". Illegal aliens DO NOT have the same rights afforded to the citizens of the United States. The narrative that they do is unconstitutional.

This is a Bill that could take us down a slippery slope is totally unnecessary. Just follow our United States Constitution and Oregon Constitution. Don't add confusion to what is already written. Democrats released this statement: "Rights granted in the United States Constitution and the Oregon Constitution include freedoms of speech and association along with rights to due process and to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures."
