Dear Chair Taylor, Vice Chair Bonham, and members of the committee,

Thank you for receiving this testimony on House Bill 3187 A on behalf of the Oregon Nurses Association (ONA). ONA represents a diverse community of more than 23,000 nurses and healthcare professionals throughout Oregon. Together we use our collective power to advocate for critical issues impacting patients, nurses, and healthcare professionals including a more effective, affordable and accessible healthcare system; better working conditions for all healthcare professionals; and healthier communities.

Oregon's nurses and healthcare workers are every age, from new grads to people who have been at the bedside for 40+ years. This is a workforce diversity that benefits patients and facilities. Fairness for community members of all ages is crucial in the eyes of healthcare workers.

HB 3187 A tackles one aspect of this fairness by prohibiting, at the beginning of the hiring process (before completion of a first interview), the employer behavior of requiring applicants to disclose age, date of birth, or graduation date.

HB 3187 A is a clear step toward making work settings in Oregon more equitable and as well as more promising for high employment and workforce stability. Thank you for opportunity to provide this testimony.
