Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3838

I'm writing to voice my opposition to House Bill 3838, a measure that I believe could have serious negative consequences for adult care homes like mine and for the vulnerable individuals we serve.

As both a care provider and a small business owner, I see firsthand the dedication and hard work that goes into running a safe, nurturing, and dignified environment for our residents. Adult care homes are a vital part of Oregon's long-term care system, offering a personalized, intimate alternative to institutional facilities.

HB 3838 imposes new mandates that, while perhaps well-intentioned, do not reflect the realities of operating a small, person-centered care setting. Unlike large facilities, we do not have administrative departments or legal teams. We wear all the hats—caregiver, manager, cook, advocate—while navigating complex state regulations and rising operating costs. Any new requirement, even a seemingly minor one, adds pressure to an already strained system.

This bill risks forcing more small providers to close their doors, which would limit access to care for those who need it most and increase the burden on already overwhelmed nursing homes and hospitals. Many adult care homes, particularly those serving diverse and underserved populations, could be disproportionately affected.

Rather than creating more challenges, I urge lawmakers to please not pass HB 3838. Let's protect the future of adult care homes and the residents who rely on them.
