My dad is late historic redeveloper Art DeMuro, founder of Venerable Properties. His passion for history and real estate brought him to Oregon just before I was born in 1991 and he dedicated the last 20 years of his life bringing historic buildings back to life to be enjoyed by generations to come. Whenever I pass one of his projects, I'm reminded not only of him, but of the reverence for history that he instilled in me and my siblings through his work. The White Stag block is not just a few buildings he worked on. They are the buildings that housed logging machinery, early Oregonian manufacturers, and continue to house the famous White Stag sign (now Portland, Oregon sign) that has a mini history all its own.

My dad moved to Oregon because of its history and charm, and I wear the label of born and bred Oregonian with pride. If Art DeMuro were here, I have no doubt he would be on the front lines of this measure, doing everything in his power to protect Oregon's treasured buildings. That's why I support HB 3190A. I support it for my dad, for my community, and for all the future generations to come.
