As the licensee of two small foster care homes specializing in senior care, I strongly OPOPSE HB 3838. Being a licensed provider since 2007 and a caregiver since 2001, I have seen this business declining year by year due to the strain of never stopping new regulation that changes and adds yearly to the load we the care providers have to navigate daily to be able to continue to stay licensed. All this increasing regulation, and additional redundant paperwork is not improving the care. Is just taking away the provider's focus from the resident's actual care and companion and is occupying too much of a day's time on completing paperwork and filling reports. This small business is so regulated already and an additional board that will pile up more regulation and standards will just make our costs go higher and the service not affordable to our clients and the adult care homes out of business soon .

Our caregivers actually feel they are blessed to work in this business where they get to know their clients like family and besides livable salaries they get the benefit of not commuting to work, not needing a car, and the live in benefit of no rent and bills. This model of care is helping our seniors and our employees. We do not want an institution made out of Our Homes. Our clients chose this model of care because other have failed them. Our elect legislators should not engage into this Union game and stop pushing HB 3838 on small care facilities.
