Hello, Representatives and community members. My name is Peter Mwangi, an Adult Foster Home operator, Nurse, caregiver, and advocate who has dedicated years to providing compassionate care for vulnerable residents.

I stand before you today not just as a small business owner, but as someone who witnesses daily the impossible choices AFHs face under our current system. House Bill 3838's \$25/hour wage mandate—while admirable in intent—threatens to collapse the very homes that Oregon's most fragile citizens rely on.

The math is undeniable: We receive less than \$75 per day per client—a rate that already forces many AFHs to subsidize care out of pocket. \$75 doesn't cover a motel room, let alone 24/7 skilled care, housing, meals, and medical support. Yet now, we're told to pay caregivers \$25/hour? Where is the funding to make this possible?

Let me be clear: AFHs want to pay living wages. But if the Board truly values 'person-centered care,' ask yourselves: What happens when AFHs close because this bill makes survival impossible? How many vulnerable Oregonians will lose their homes—their *families*—because the state imposed standards without providing resources?

This isn't hypothetical. My own home—and hundreds like it—face an agonizing choice: **Break the law or break our promise to residents.** Neither serves our community.

I urge you: Vote NO on HB 3838 unless it includes funding to sustain AFHs. Do not sacrifice Oregon's most vulnerable for an unfunded mandate. Protect our homes. Protect our residents.
