The Bottle Bill has been a model of environmental success, helping to keep bottles and cans out of our roads and natural areas. If not for the Bottle Bill, the roads and natural areas would be littered with bottles and cans. Oregonians presently recycle more than 2 billion bottles and cans annually and more than \$200 million in refunds is returned to consumers every year. The Bottle Bill is a proven, private recycling system that operates without taxpayer funding while delivering nation-leading results.

Changing the way the Bottle Bill works to help fund wildfire defense is not the correct approach.
