On behalf of Portland Playhouse, I am writing to express our strong support for Portland State University's request for \$85 million in Article XI(G) Bond funding to build academic facilities as part of a state-of-the-art Performing Arts and Culture Center.

Portland Playhouse is a professional theater company dedicated to producing quality, intimate performances while delivering transformative educational programs to hundreds of students through our Fall Festival of Shakespeare and Spring Social Justice Festival. We support this project because it will provide the mid-sized venue (800-1,200 seats) that Portland's arts ecosystem desperately needs, create new opportunities for K-12 arts education partnerships, and help revitalize downtown Portland by establishing a vibrant cultural hub where diverse communities can gather and connect.

This once-in-a-century opportunity will create a nationally distinct performing arts and education center in downtown Portland. With the City committed to replacing the aging Keller Auditorium, this project will transform our city by anchoring an entertainment and education district that restores confidence in downtown and elevates Oregon's statewide arts ecosystem.
