We regularly refer survivors to the Domestic Violence Clinic, and our long-standing partnership has greatly improved access to life-saving legal resources.

The Clinic provides high-quality, trauma-informed legal representation in restraining order cases, family law matters, and other civil legal proceedings that are essential to ensuring survivor safety. Beyond direct legal services, the Clinic plays a vital role in training the next generation of attorneys in how to work effectively and compassionately with survivors of abuse. This not only expands current access to legal services but also strengthens the legal field's long-term capacity to serve survivors in Oregon and beyond.

Importantly, the Clinic recognizes the complex and interconnected needs of survivors. Its collaborative relationships with Hope & Safety Alliance and other community organizations ensure that survivors receive wraparound support—legal advocacy, safety planning, emotional support, and more—all coordinated through trusted partnerships.

There remains a significant and ongoing need for free, accessible legal services for low-income survivors in our community. The Domestic Violence Clinic has consistently demonstrated expertise, compassion, and commitment in meeting that need. I respectfully urge the Committee to continue its investment in this critical program, which protects the rights, safety, and dignity of survivors while also shaping the future of equitable, survivor-centered legal practice.
