It is especially important to note that every state surrounding Oregon, with the exception of California, has adopted broader physical therapy practice acts. For Oregon-based clinics like ours, this creates a significant challenge in recruiting and retaining top-tier talent, particularly in rural and underserved regions.

HB 3824 is not about pushing boundaries—it's about aligning with national standards, embracing modern best practices, and ensuring that Oregon residents can access the same level of care as individuals in Washington, Idaho, Utah, or Nevada. This bill supports patient-centered care, reduces delays in treatment, and strengthens Oregon's healthcare workforce in a time when access and efficiency are more important than ever.

I urge you to support House Bill 3824 and help us create a future where Oregonians receive the best care possible, delivered by professionals who are empowered to use the full extent of their skills, education, and clinical judgment.
