I do this work because I care deeply about children and their health and wellbeing, including the freedom to read. According to PEN America, there were 10,046 book bans in the 2023-2024 school year, and have been increasing in recent years. Studies have shown that book bans negatively impact youth mental health. When the ability to access books that feature people who look like you, feel like you, and experience the world as you do is cut off, children suffer.

All of Oregon's children deserve to have access to books that they can relate to; that expand their horizons into how other people experience the world around them; and that give them accurate and timely information. While every parent has the right to make decisions about which books are appropriate for their children and families, no parent or other individual has the right to decide which books should be available or unavailable for all children.
