My name is Nichole Smith, and I'm the Head Coach of WOU's Women's+ Rugby Club. I am writing to you on behalf of my team, as well as those who utilize the turf field for various reasons. I respectfully submit this letter to express an urgent and united need: to returf our turf field. That field is so important to so many different individuals, from club and intramural sports to individuals not affiliated with a sport within WOU. By doing so, WOU is dedicated to supporting the growth, safety, and success of our club and intramural sports programs and helping to increase physical activity for other students. Therefore, I strongly support the \$1.4 million Article F Bond Request, which will fund crucial improvements to athletic facilities on campus.

Club sports at WOU play a vital role in fostering leadership, teamwork, and school spirit across campus. Our program offers inclusive opportunities for athletes of all skill levels to compete, build community, and represent our university with pride. However, our current facilities are no longer meeting the needs of this growing program, and there are concerns regarding safety in such a physical sport as rugby. A new turf field would drastically reduce maintenance needs, allow year-round use, and provide a reliable, high-quality surface that elevates the students' experience.

This new field would also serve the broader campus and local community.
