Our 80+ members represent the full value chain of the hydrogen ecosystem – hydrogen technology and service providers, equipment manufacturers, project developers, public transit agencies, labor unions, utilities, and many others with an interest in the clean and renewable hydrogen sector. Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on SB 685A on behalf of RHA and its members.

We appreciate the opportunity to contribute to amendments that were adopted in the Senate Chamber addressing timing and standards. With their adoption, RHA is pleased to support SB 685A, which will establish reasonable protections that allow the hydrogen market to develop while respecting community transparency.
