I am writing to express my strong support for HB 3824A, the PT Modernization Act.

As a clinician deeply embedded in the daily realities of patient care, I see how outdated statutes can create unnecessary delays and barriers for those who most need our help. HB 3824A proposes critical updates that align Oregon's practice laws with the current scope, training, and standards of Doctors of Physical Therapy nationwide.

This bill would enable physical therapists to order diagnostic imaging, prescribe durable medical equipment, certify disability placards, perform dry needling, and maintain the integrity of the DPT designation. Each of these changes is grounded in our extensive education and clinical competencies. More importantly, they are designed to improve outcomes for Oregonians by removing administrative bottlenecks that prolong suffering and inflate healthcare costs.

The inclusion of dry needling is especially significant.
