Unchecked surveillance powers are often used against the very people our democracy is supposed to protect: protesters, journalists, community organizers, and already over-policed neighborhoods. Giving police the ability to conduct aerial surveillance without a judge's approval undermines the Fourth Amendment and invites abuse.

Oregonians deserve meaningful privacy protections. If there is truly a need for drone surveillance, law enforcement should go through the proper channels and get a warrant. That's how we preserve public trust and protect constitutional rights.

Please reject SB 238A and stand up for civil liberties.
