Staff Proposal

Close red fox harvest in SNRF range

Proposed OAR language:

Red Fox Season Open Area: Entire state except that portion fifteen miles from the Pacific Crest Trail from Washington to Interstate 5

Season Recommendations

- Maintain No Harvest Season Closures for: Badger, Nutria, Opossum, Skunks, Weasels, Coyote
- Maintain No Open Harvest Season for:
 Fisher, Ringtail, Wolverine, Kit Fox, Canada Lynx, Sea Otter
- No changes to Harvest Season for:
 Beaver, Bobcat, Marten, Muskrat, Mink, Raccoon, River Otter
- No changes to Pursuit Season for: Bobcat, Gray Fox, Red Fox, and Raccoon

I move to amend Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 635, Division 045 and 050 as proposed by staff to set regulations and seasons for the harvest and pursuit of furbearing mammals.
