I Strongly SUPPORT SB 88.

This legislation addresses a fundamental issue of fairness and accountability. Ratepayers should not be required to fund expenses that are not directly tied to the delivery of essential utility services. Advertising campaigns designed to enhance a company's public image, lobbying to shape legislation in their favor, and high-dollar executive compensation packages do not serve the public interest and should not be charged to customers.

These are the consequences of a company's actions and should be paid by shareholders, not by the people who rely on these services to power their homes and businesses.

This bill reinforces the principle that utility rates should reflect only the legitimate, prudent costs of providing electricity or gas—not expenses designed to benefit the utility's private interests.

By enacting this legislation, we protect ratepayers, promote transparency, and hold utilities accountable to the public they serve.
