 This is the annual rent increase percentage to current tenants since January 1, 2019,
 not including
 utilities (\$80 monthly), compared to Soc. Sec. COLA:

Part of the 75% of Low Income could be considered Lower Low Income because
 their income is
 more than \$1394, but considerably less than \$2600.

In my 40+ years of living in this community, there have been many changes. Residents have grown older, retired, lost loved ones and the majority are on limited income (Soc Sec).

Rent has gone from \$72 (with utilities) to \$1015 (plus utilities).

This was a Mom & Pop 55+ Community and all residents paid the same monthly rent, with small increases each year.

The Community was purchased in 2014 and is managed by an Investment Property firm.

From 2015 to present, move-in rent for new tenants has increased from \$368 to \$1015 (plus utilities).

Since 1/1/2015, all month to month residents have had an 8% annual average increase in rent.

Therefore current rents will range from \$632 to \$1015 (plus utilities)

As stated earlier, many residents of this Community are retired, many live on a limited income.

Please Pass HB3054A with a 6% maximum annual rent increase for Communities like mine.
