My name is Nidhi Samosawala, and I am a licensed physical therapist practicing at Impact Physical Therapy of Hillsboro. I write today in strong support of HB 3824A, the Physical Therapy Modernization Act.

I urge you to pass HB 3824A. It is a smart, patient-centered reform that strengthens safety, transparency, and access to care in Oregon. Thank you for your consideration and for your commitment to modernizing our healthcare laws.
