HB3054 addresses those that are renting... SPACES...(These are space rentals in MHPs and Marinas, that have been long established as affordable housing).

It is not correct nor accurate to say that supporting this bill will work against Oregon's ability to provide housing.

On the other hand, opposing HB3054 WILL adversely effect many of our seniors and others in MHPs...leading them to give up their home because they cant afford the space their home rests on.
