One cannot get this training in 200 hr dry needling courses. Every person and patient I know who had nerve damage got it from "dry needling". Above and beyond the appropriation of East Asian culture (which acupuncturists are immersed in), dry needling is unsafe. Period.

Please look to Nevada where they require 1000 hours of training for PTs. This is not only about protecting our practice, but about protecting our patients.
