The proposed amendment ensures climate change instruction within core academic standards. It represents a significant and positive shift. HB 3365 directly aligns with the Oregon Department of Education's goals by fostering Social Science Essential Disciplinary Practices such as developing critical inquiry skills and constructing well-reasoned arguments regarding complex societal issues. By integrating climate change education across subjects, this bill empowers students to analyze the causes and effects of this global challenge and to actively participate in developing strategies for mitigation, adaptation, and community resilience – key elements of informed civic action.

Furthermore, HB 3365 supports the ODE's emphasis on Transformative Social Emotional Learning by creating a space for students to explore the societal impacts of climate change, including issues of justice and equity, and to develop empathy for diverse perspectives. It also answers ODE's call for inclusive social science by ensuring that future standards can incorporate culturally relevant examples and the perspectives of traditionally underrepresented groups in the context of climate change and sustainability.

Ultimately, HB 3365 is a vital step towards equipping Oregon's students with the knowledge, skills, and dispositions necessary to thrive in a changing world and to contribute to a more just and sustainable future, directly supporting the broader goals of the Oregon Department of Education.
