A Transformed Hoyt Arboretum

Classroom Space

Two new classrooms will create capacity to serve 10,000 students annually. A new outdoor classroom will allow year-round learning experiences.

Greenhouse & Nursery

Tripled space to conserve species that are threatened or endangered in the wild and to cultivate climate-resilient plants for the next 100 years at Hoyt Arboretum.

Public Accessibility

Expanded, accessible trails and gathering spaces will enhance the visitor experience. Ten modern restrooms will accommodate the Arboretum's 400,000 annual visitors.

New Visitor Center

The existing outdated and undersized facility will be upgraded to a New Visitor Center with enhanced educational exhibits and amenities.
