As a Doctor of Physical Therapy in clinical practice for the past ten years, I have never understood why I was NOT allowed to order imaging, as our 7 years of education fully equips us to diagnose and to perform medical screening/refer out when appropriate. With the current healthcare environment and staffing issues causing some patients to wait months to get in to a PCP or other physician prior to having access to imaging, there is no time like the present to reduce this barrier to access. Many of my patients who self refer to PT would be appreciative of my having the opportunity to use my entire skill set/education/training, including ordering imaging when appropriate.
