Please support HB 2977, 1% for Wildlife, so that our state secures long-term, sustainable funding for conservation and recovery of our state's most imperiled wildlife and fish species and their habitats.

Since moving here for grad school nearly a decade ago, I've gotten to know and love Oregon through hiking in our old-growth forests, whale watching on the coast, and rafting the McKenzie and Rogue rivers. Each outing, I learn more about Oregon's incredible diversity or flora and fauna and am in continued awe of the place I get to call home. Whenever friends and family come to visit, we share the beauty of Oregon's unique landscapes and species by getting out into the woods or onto the river. Without adequate, reliable and sustained funding, ODFW is often unable to effectively implement the State Wildlife Action Plan. I support HB 2977 because it will provide a reliable, sustained, long-term funding source so ODFW can implement the plan and conserve and recover Oregon's most vulnerable wildlife and habitat.

Please support this common-sense approach to ensure ODFW has the funds it needs to conserve and recover Oregon's most threatened wildlife, fish and their habitats for this and future generations.
