On behalf of the students of Climate Action Club at Churchill High School in Eugene, we endorse HB-3365. It is our job as a club to ensure students are educated and equipped to tackle the climate crisis. It is for this reason that we believe this bill will lead to the furthering of development for a sustainable world.

We are aware of the burden which teachers face, however we believe that by integrating climate literacy organically into existing content standards, HB-3365 will not significantly increase strain on educators.
