Hello, I am writing in support of HB 3824. I am a Doctor of Physical Therapy practicing in Austin, Texas who utilizes dry needling practices with my clients. I did a clinical rotation in Eugene, Oregon while in PT school and the number one thing patients are asking for right now is access to dry needling from a Doctor of Physical Therapy. Oregon is ONE of FOUR states left in the entire US that does not allow Physical Therapists to practice dry needling. The oppositions argument on safety is simply opinion as there has been ample evidence now over the past 5-10 years that proves the safety and efficacy of PTs safely performing dry needling practices. I argue that as health care providers and legislators, our jobs our to do whatever we can to HELP OUR PEOPLE. Gatekeeping the practice of using a thin monofilament needle is only stopping our people from getting the help they need.
