I wanted to bring your attention to a bill that's being heard in the Oregon Senate Health Committee on Tuesday, May 6th - Oregon House Bill 3824 (PT Modernization Act). Passing this act could significantly decrease your workload and improve your patient outcomes. This legislation would also align Oregon's PT practice with 46 other states, allowing us to practice to the full extent of our extensive doctoral level training, while reducing unnecessary administrative burden on healthcare providers like you.
