My name is Travis Bledsoe, and I am an Oregon resident and law-abiding citizen who stands in defense of our constitutional right to bear arms. What's more concerning is the unknown and untold fiscal impact this legislation could have on Oregon taxpayers and small businesses. The state has not provided a comprehensive financial assessment of the resources needed for enforcement, compliance tracking, or administrative oversight. This uncertainty only adds to the burden being placed on responsible citizens and small business owners, with no clear evidence of public safety benefits.

Above all, this policy conflicts with the U.S. Constitution and the Oregon Constitution, which explicitly affirm the right of individuals to keep and bear arms. Rights delayed are rights denied.
