







FIRE, RESCUE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE

South Hillsboro Fire Station 9 is a new facility that will provide fire, rescue, and emergency medical care to support the growing South Hillsboro neighborhood. Three apparatus bays and bunk rooms will support two crews and a battalion chief. Biophilic and trauma informed design will support first responder mental health.

HOUSING PRODUCTION

As Oregon's largest master planned community, South Hillsboro has permitted 3,385 new homes in the last decade and once complete, will house 20,000 people in more than 8,000 units that will be served by Fire Station 9.

COMMUNITY RESILIENCY AND DISASTER RESPONSE

Fire Station 9 will serve as an **essential facility** providing both a Building Division Department Operations Center and Emergency Operations Center, activated during a disaster to aid in the community's recovery.

Designed for immediate occupancy after a large seismic event, it includes a water well, generator, and fuel storage that will enable the building to be operational for a minimum of 3 weeks following a disaster, until power and fuel sources are available.

The City of Hillsboro, like other jurisdictions around the state, is facing a funding deficit for public safety infrastructure and equipment. Historically, state and federal funding has not been available for public safety improvements, and the City relies on its general funds to fund fire and rescue related costs. State investment is crucial to the success of this project.
