I am writing as a parent in the Tigard-Tualatin School District and a strong supporter of House Bill 2251, which calls for statewide limits on personal electronic device use by students during the school day.

Over the past few years, I've watched with growing concern as smartphones have become a persistent source of distraction in our children's classrooms.
