Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony and request funding to SAVE the Lacey Lady's home.

As the Executive Director of the B-17 Alliance Museum and Restoration Hangar in Salem, I witness multicultural learning daily. We engage over 6,000 people annually, including 1500 students aged 3 to 99. Our programs and outreach provide generational cross-training. Our volunteers, nearly all Veterans, train students, teach them about history, and educate them on STEM education.

This B-17 is one of fewer than 50 remaining in the world. It has the lowest airtime of any B-17 in the world and is one of 10 capable of flying again. The B-17 has a wingspan of 102 feet. You can't purchase parts at the corner market, so every part must be rebuilt. This is all done by volunteers.

B-17 Alliance has a positive impact on our communities. It is a place of hope, education, and inspirational activities. Over a hundred volunteers regularly participate in this once-in-a-lifetime experience. This complex volunteer opportunity has saved many a veteran who was at the end of their rope. Restoring an aircraft is complex, and they are dedicated to its completion.

In addition, we share the personal stories of our Greatest Generation: the men, women, and even children who demonstrate characteristics that foster unity in the community. They never gave up; they did what they had to do, and many made the ultimate sacrifice. This was a time when we all pulled together for a common cause. These stories are the tools we need to build community, bring hope to one another, and give purpose to thousands of people's lives.

B-17 Alliance was formed in 2006 to save these stories so that we would Never Forget the sacrifices made for our freedom.

The process of restoring one of the few remaining B-17 Flying Fortress aircraft from World War II quickly became a pathway for diversity and community connection. The **Home of the Lacey Lady**, provides hope, education, inspiration, and a place to gather and gain purpose for life.

We are an Alliance of people who care. We represent a broad spectrum of community members and nationalities and have a unique ability to teach all ages.
