Please revise HB 3824 to not allow Physical Therapist or an assistant to practice "needle insertion".

not include training standards or oversight when performing the needling practices.

chosen. All were very passionate about their career and helping people obtain wellness. Most patients

training and knowledge and they are attempting to find the exact point for insertion of needle, I would not use their services.

I understand the intent may be to make this treatment more available, but I believe this could be a safely issue. Let's not lower medical standards.
