Many forest owners grow timber on their land and would like to see the fruits of their labor put into a home. Timber milled into lumber stores carbon, contributing to an improved environment. A small sawmill produces lumber often of higher quality than lumber yard bought. By teaching small mill operators how to grade the lumber they cut, that otherwise would be used for firewood, will sequester carbon in a livable home. With the additional reduction of greenhouse gases resulting from burning the same wood. It is impractical to hire a professional grader to grade the small volume of lumber from these mills. As a 25 year member of Oregon Small Woodlands Association, I have had many opportunities to interact with Oregon State Extension and find them knowledgeable and professional.
