As it is today, they get to keep that \$60,000,000.00 in their pocket while they pay attorneys to help them lower the potential future payout.

My next-door neighbor passed about two years after the fire. The general community is elderly. Some members have died and more will die without ever receiving any compensation. Please help us. Support legislation that holds Pacificorp accountable. Justice delayed truly is justice denied.
