The Special Districts Association of Oregon (SDAO) represents approximately 950 districts with 32 types of districts across the state that play a crucial role in delivering essential public services to our citizens, including fire protection, water supply, sanitation, libraries, parks and recreation, irrigation and more. Our association would like to express its support of the amendments under consideration to SB 243 that would allow special district governing bodies to discuss publicly whether concealed firearm permit holders should be allowed to carry within buildings where the governing body conducts official meetings.

Our association is diverse in both its geography and leanings regarding firearms.
