## **Testimony in Support of HB 3631**Oregon Alliance of Boys & Girls Clubs

Chair Kropf, Chair Prozanski, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of **House Bill 3631**.

We do this by working hand-in-hand with schools, families, and community partners to implement **evidence-based prevention strategies** that foster healthy development, build resilience, and respond to the realities facing youth across Oregon.

Our Clubs are not peripheral to this work—we are **central to the success of community-based prevention infrastructure**. In regions like **Jackson and Josephine Counties**, our Clubs have become the **operational backbone** for local prevention efforts. We provide the physical space, trusted relationships, and daily programming that bring policy into practice—effectively and equitably.

We have also engaged directly with the **Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission (ADPC) Prevention Subcommittee**. When the committee released its **draft Prevention Strategic Priorities for 2026–2030** less than 2 months ago, we were there to offer input and support. We see a strong, clear alignment between the Commission's framework and our on-the-ground work across Oregon.

The message is unmistakable: **Oregon must invest in a coordinated, well-resourced prevention system that bridges K-12 education and community organizations like ours**. This is not a future need—it is a present necessity. And the infrastructure already exists to act now.

As highlighted in the ADPC Prevention Subcommittee's spring meetings, stakeholders emphasized the importance of **building cross-sector capacity**, supporting culturally responsive prevention programs, and ensuring services reach all young people—**not just those already in crisis**. HB 3631 directly addresses these priorities by:

- **Investing in upstream prevention strategies** that reduce youth substance use and mental health challenges;
- Building sustainable partnerships between schools, families, and community providers;
- And creating statewide coordination and accountability to track outcomes and reduce service gaps.

As Representative Mannix referenced during the public hearing, this investment could provide valuable insight into future investment opportunities- especially the critical value-add that our network of Boy & Girls Clubs, YMCAs, camps and afterschool programs bring to this effort.

We have a proven ability to leverage private and philanthropic funding to amplify state investments. Boys & Girls Club nationally demonstrates a \$10.32 return on investment—every dollar of public support through HB 3631 can be significantly extended through private partnerships, local matching funds, and in-kind contributions, allowing us to scale high-impact prevention programs further and faster than public systems alone.

This ability to braid funding across systems not only strengthens outcomes—it ensures cost-effective, community-rooted delivery of services to youth who need it most.

Prevention is most effective when it is proactive, comprehensive, and community-driven. HB 3631 honors that vision by resourcing the very partnerships we know must exist to advance state prevention efforts. This bill is not only a smart investment—it's a necessary step toward ensuring Oregon's youth can thrive in safe, supportive environments.

I urge you to pass HB 3631 and help build the foundation for a healthier future for all Oregonians.
